Corner Stores and Small Businesses

Corner stores and small businesses are granted funds only for equipment costs. Corner stores, which include small-scale or grocery stores, either independent or chain, that sell a limited selection of foods and other products, that are located in a low-income or low-food access area in a rural, urban, or suburban region. Small businesses including but not limited to small farm operations with farm stands or stores, that sell to low-income or low-food access clientele.
